It is something we have greatly missed since the ACT went into lockdown but let me assure you that we have not wasted a minute of this time. With many lessons learned from the 2020 lock down, our Google classroom sessions kicked off straight away to support families at home and the incorporation of more live zoom sessions for children to join. Keeping in touch with our community this way has helped us to stay positive and still feel a connection with you all. Not all of us are the most tech savvy people in the world, so we feel so grateful to see many of our educators stepping up and sharing their tech skills to help this part of our program run as smoothly as possible.

With this newsletter, we thought to update you on some of the things we have worked on while you've been at home. Since painting occurred in 2020 our library was a big area needing some restructuring. Our educators have done a years' worth of sorting, scanning, covering and labelling in a matter of weeks. Our library is nearly done now and has never looked so good thanks to the huge effort from all our team. Sorting through these resources have also helped our educators to find new and interesting felt boards, books and puppets to use in their online learning.

Many upgrades have been made to our indoor/outdoor environments, furniture, and equipment, with Jono having a few more helpers to achieve this big list of tasks. We have almost finished painting our preschool bathroom to better match the colours chosen for the preschool room last year. This has given the area a much-needed freshening up. All indoor tables have also been sanded back and repainted and look like new. Storeroom resources have been cleaned out and sorted.

In the outdoor areas a large hedge was sadly removed by ANU making our big garden very exposed to the windows of the childcare centre next door. Educators reflected that this didn't give our children much privacy for their play, so a wooden fence has been installed and painted along this area. Gardening has been another focus, with the toddler paved area getting a much needed tidy up and re-planting. Educators plan to extend this work to the ANU community garden over the next few weeks since their volunteers are unable to come and work. The community garden contributes largely to our children's learning and commitment to sustainability so it is of great importance to look after it for when evervone returns.

Professional development has been another area educators have used their time. Doing training on behaviour guidance, food safety, our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), our Quality Improvement Plan (QIP). Other sessions to complement programs such as exploring STEM, fire laboratories, tools and exploring the Arts with children (and much more).

Finally, we would like to quickly let you know that at the beginning of lockdown Tomasz from the Wattle and Grevillia Room handed in his resignation. He has decided to explore a new journey in the Early Education Sector, working with special needs children. We wish him all the best in this new endeavour. At the end of lockdown the toddler room will be looking for an new and energetic educator to join their amazing team.

We are definitely keeping busy, but missing you all so much.
