Running a childcare centre and program from a makeshift online classroom was approached with such team strength and comradeship. Looking back at this inconvenience shows the talent and drive of the educators, who were able to turn such a negative into an adventure.

Painting Heritage has been an ongoing conversation since I started in 2006, and it took the frightening hailstorm in January to finally get the approval and go ahead from ANU. The painters have worked since April and have almost completed painting the building- hoping to be finished early in the new year. Kirsty and Ria have joined the team under the great mentorship of Alicia and Ryan, which enabled a very successful transition as Ryan finished his final prac and Alicia went on to the next step in her career to teach in the primary school system. Ria has joined us from Melbourne, her experience and professional approach to education has made the lead team in the preschool room a very knowledgeable, enthusiastic and strong team. Ria has completed her Bachelor of Education and has great respect for inquiry based learning and teaching "outside the fence". We are so excited to see this enthusiasm within the team and the progress & new perspectives given to our programs in 2021.

Committee Chairperson Report

The Heritage Management Committee has met to consider the annual budget and fee setting for 2021. Given the continued level of uncertainty, the committee has adopted a considered but cautious approach to setting fees. We are proposing to increase fees by \$5 per day (from \$132.50 to \$137.50) from 6th January 2021. This fee increase is within the up to \$6.50 per day, per year increase previously approved a Heritage's AGM. The \$5 per day increase results in a small budgeted loss for Heritage of around \$8000 for 2021. The Committee determined that a smaller increase with a small budgeted loss is appropriate and still financially prudent as the centre has sufficient reserves to call on should additional funding be required. The committee notes however that the medium term budget continues to propose an increase of \$6.50 per day in each year beyond 2021, noting that the actual fee setting is done each year.

Due to the uncertainty, Heritage will plan on doing a mid-year budget review to ensure we continue to manage the centre's finances in a prudent manner. We are also developing a capital management plan to ensure we effectively use the centre's cash reserves for the future. We anticipate socialising a draft of the capital management plan over the coming months.
