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## WHAT HAS CHANGED WITH COVID-19

Dear Families,

What a year we have had with fires, smoke, hail and now COVID-19. Each and every one of us - little and big - has had a tremendous amount of changes happening in our life, outside of our control and have had to work out a way to smile through it all.

What we have here at Heritage is special. Our community - our educators, our families, our children - it just has this special aura about it. I am so proud to be a part of this collective and know, because of the strength of this community, we will get through whatever we have to and get to the other side.

There is a lot of good that will come out of what's happening around the world at the moment; like the way people, neighbourhoods and communities pull together to help one another. However, there is also much sadness, pain and unprecedented change to the way we normally do things and we just have to make the best we can of new situations. I try to remain forever an optimist, but this week was the hardest in my professional life, that is for sure.

As of Monday 6th April 2020 - how we used to operate no longer exists. The way we invoice, use software, record absences, etc all changed. A whole new system came into play. There is no longer Child Care Subsidy (CCS), no hours based on activity tests, no gap payments for parents to make.

All direct debits for accounts up to date have been stopped. For those who have a debt outstanding - this will continue for you until the account is up to date. Salary sacrifice is now put on hold. This will remain in place until the government informs us otherwise.

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#### What this means for you?

Everything up until Sunday 5th April 2020 will remain how it was. The final week is processed and that's it done (forever or just a little while I don't know?) You will no longer be charged a fee for childcare.

#### What does that mean for us?

The Government has stopped us from receiving revenue the way we were previously and told every service that they will receive 50% of their CCS base rate fee of \$11.98 per hour for the total number of children they had enrolled at a certain point of time in February. We will then receive this amount each week.

Receiving this low hourly amount automatically gives Heritage access to the new Job Keeper payment of \$1500 a fortnight, per eligible staff member. Heritage will still have to top up wages and pay super/long service leave. Running cost of the centre does not go on hold either and based on our calculations Heritage stands to lose \$120,000 this year if these conditions go through to September. Heritage has built up a highly skilled team of educators over the years and will strive to keep all full-time educators employed. We have had to let our regular and well-loved casuals go but hope to be able to reemploy them once this is all over. I know I work with an incredible team and I'm sure our families will stand with us to ensure they continue to have secure employment. I am so proud of the way they have strived to keep up our education standards and foster our communities' sense of belonging through this uncertain time.



How to raise emotionally realthy children

This book replaces the popular Children are people too. Written for parents, it explains that although we often share the same values of the guidance approach, we end up instead using the controlling practices of rewards and punishments. This is mainly because we ourselves were raised that way, and because we get into a dance with our spirited children of coercion on our part and rebellion on theirs. However, the more we try to control these spirited children, the worse their behaviour gets. The book will help parents to prevent behavioural problems in children, support children who are distressed, be assertive when our own needs are not being met, and solve problems collaboratively. It also offers ways to solve persistent behavioural problems and reminds us to be compassionate towards

This book is intended to accompany Parental guidance recommended and give parents activities and exercises to practise guidance skills, such as acknowledging rather than praising children, listening to children, being assertive and solving problems collaboratively. It also gives some activities for looking after ourselves.
